PROGRAM: Six-Week Horseshoeing Course

TRAINING HOURS: 300 Clock Hours

Our six week course includes basic, hot, cold, and corrective shoeing. This course consists of classroom instruction and practical experience. Upon completion, each student will be qualified to start their own farrier business or take care of their own horses. Others might be interested in working at a racetrack, horse farm, or privately owned horses.

CLASSES:

Classes are held Monday through Friday from 8a.m. until 5p.m. This OSHS program is performance based, which means that all students must reach a required proficiency. To assist students in the undertaking an additional 60 hours of video instruction and forge time is required. As necessary, additional after-hours study and practice are highly encouraged and recommended!

Class Hours consist of instructional and practical experience as follows:

Hours	Resident Hands-on Supervised Curriculum
30	Classroom lectures by staff instructors on anatomy and corrective shoeing
120	Practical horseshoeing hot and cold in the shoeing classroom
42	Forge work including creating handmade plain and corrective shoes from bar stock and instruction in making specialty tools
48	Horseshoeing in the field using the portable shoeing rig
60	Video and forge work "MANDATORY"

300 Total Clock Hours

Lunch: One hour break around noon as determined by the instructor.

Break: Class's break at 10 A.M. and 3 P.M. for a 15-minute coffee break.

SIX-WEEKS HORSESHOEING COURSE

300 CLOCK HOURS

An official O.S.H.S. diploma will be issued upon completion of the course. Classes are held from 8:00a.m. to 5:00p.m., five days a week. Plus, 60 hours of assignments after 5:00p.m. and weekends.

EXPLANATION OF TUITION AND FEES

The Total Cost for the Six-Week Horseshoeing Course is \$5,500.00. This includes tuition, books, toolbox, and a complete set of hand tools, anvil, apron, and dormitory fee. All tools are your purchases to keep and use throughout the course. We also have an on-site dormitory with separate quarters for women. All other supplies, equipment, and tools will be furnished by O.S.H.S. There are no refund on your tools, supplies, and book purchases. There is no refund on the dormitory fee, due to the reasonable below cost fee.

ITEMIZED TUITION AND FEES

Total Cost of includes the cost of instructors, use of all of O.S.H.S. equipment, and live horses furnished by O.S.H.S. for the students to shoe.

To enroll in O.S.H.S. each student must send \$250.00 deposit with a completed application. The remaining \$5,250.00 will be paid on the first day of class. Visa, MasterCard, personal checks, and cashier checks are accepted.

STUDENT TOOLS

OSHS training agreement requires the student to purchase the following tools for \$900.00:

(You can upgrade one or all of these tools at any time they are issued)

- O.S.H.S. has all necessary equipment to set you up in the horseshoeing business, including forges, shoes, nails, etc.
- Students are asked to check into school on Sunday afternoon between 1:00 p.m. and 5 p.m. All classes begin on Monday.
- Classes are limited to 22 students at O.S.H.S. with three instructors enabling each student to receive one-on-one instruction as needed.

At O.S.H.S. we prepare our students to be self-employed Farriers. We will give you instruction on how to start your business, acquire clientele, bookkeeping, and advertising. We do not provide job placement. Our contacts are limited, but we will assist you to the best of our ability.

VETERANS

Our school is approved for Veteran's Training. To enroll, contact your local Veteran's Administration Office. On the first day of class bring the documents with you and we will complete the forms in our office.

You must pay the deposit with your enrollment and the balance upon your arrival. The V.A. according to their specifications will reimburse your portion of the tuition to you.

REHABILITATION STUDENTS

See your State or Local rehabilitation agent in your area and they will give you the full details. Approved for WIA training.
